# Bios for Kibagabaga Programme



## Dr Rob Cooper

**Robert Cooper** is an Adelaide based consultant radiologist who has completed a specialist Nuclear Medicine training and PET credentialling and has a special interest in oncologic imaging. He has co-authored a textbook chapter on Musculoskeletal SPECT imaging. Robert holds public hospital appointments in radiology at the Royal Adelaide Hospital and Flinders Medical Centre.

## Dr Frank Stening

**Frank Stening** is a General Surgeon, specializing in abdominal upper GI surgery, especially laparoscopic surgery. He graduated MB, BS from Sydney University in 1960, was admitted as FRACS in 1965, undertook a Surgical Residency RPAH in Sydney between 1963 and 1967, was a GI Fellow at UCLA 1967–68, Surgical Fellow at Sir Rodney Smith in London during 1969, reader in Surgery RPAH 1970–72, reader in Surgery, Acting Professor of Surgery at Austin Hospital, University of Melbourne 1972–1975, Pan Pacific Surgical Fellow 1975–79, Consultant ICRC Geneva 1979–1990, VMO Surgery Bowral Hospital 1979–2006.

## Dr Katherine Edyvane

**Katherine Edyvane** is a broadly trained general and trauma surgeon from Perth, Western Australia, Australia, and Head of Surgery at Rockingham Hospital. She has a strong interest in emergency aid work, and long-term medical aid development. From 2006–2008 she was the fulltime surgeon advisor to the Dili National Hospital in East Timor, where she was involved in the daily delivery of surgical care, local capacity building, development of a surgical teaching program

for district medical officers, and the formulation of national treatment guidelines. In Australia she has been involved in medical teaching for the last 20 years. She also holds a PhD in medical research.

## Prof Suren Krishnan

**Suren Krishnan** is a graduate of the University of Adelaide Medical School and an Otolaryngologist, Head and Neck Surgeon trained in the Adelaide Training Program. He received his fellowship in Otolaryngology, Head and Neck Surgery from the Royal Australasian College of Surgeons in 1993 and was a Fellow at the Radcliffe Infirmary, Oxford, United Kingdom in 1994. He is Clinical Associate Professor of Surgery at the University of Adelaide. Mr. Krishnan was awarded a medal in the Order of Australia on the Queen's Birthday.

## Dr John Gan

**John Gan** is a vascular surgeon who practices at Port Macquarie Base Hospital, a regional hospital in New South Wales, Australia. He trained in General Surgery in Sydney, Australia. He spent two years in post fellowship positions in Glasgow, Scotland gaining experience in vascular surgery. Later he undertook a two year post fellowship training in Vascular Surgery in Melbourne and Sydney, Australia. Currently he works as a vascular surgeon and also as a Senior Lecturer in Surgery at the Rural Clinical School of the University of New South Wales in Port Macquarie.

## Prof Kate Drummond

**Kate Drummond** is a neurosurgeon at The Royal Melbourne Hospital and Coordinator of the Cancer Domain at The University of Melbourne.

She trained in Melbourne, Sydney and Brigham and Women's Hospital / Harvard University in Boston. She received her MD from the University of Melbourne in 2008. Her clinical and research interest is Neuro-Oncology (brain tumours), and she is Head of the Central Nervous System Tumour Stream at the Royal Melbourne Hospital. She is Chair of the Women in Surgery Committee of the Royal Australasian College of Surgeons, Director of Junior Surgical Training at The Royal Melbourne Hospital and is a keen mentor and teacher of junior staff and students.

### Prof Jegan Krishnan

**Jegan Krishnan** commenced at Flinders Medical Centre as the Lecturer in Orthopaedic Surgery in 1993 following a two-year period overseas as a visiting Orthopaedic Surgeon. He progressed to being Senior Clinical Director of Orthopaedic Surgery in 1995 and was appointed as Associate Professor in 1995. Professor Krishnan was appointed to the inaugural Chair in Orthopaedic Surgery, Flinders University in May 2001. Professor Krishnan has also had major involvement in orthopaedic education and training. He has established several Orthopaedic Fellowship Training Exchanges with developing nations in the Asia Pacific region.

### Dr Vijay Roach

**Vijay Roach** is an obstetrician and gynecologist working in private and public practice in Sydney, Australia. He is a Councilor with the Royal Australian and New Zealand College of Obstetricians and Gynecologists, Lecturer at the University of Sydney and Chairman of the Gidget Foundation, a not for profit organisation whose mission is to raise awareness of perinatal anxiety and depression. He is married with

### Dr Paul Anderson

**Paul Anderson** is a consultant surgeon in Adelaide, South Australia. His undergraduate medical education was at the University of Cape Town / Groote Schuur hospital.
